Top Ramen Salad

6 servings, 450 calories Ingredients

Salad:

2 (3 Oz) packages chicken-flavored ramen noodles, broken into pieces, seasoning packets reserved ½ c raw sunflower seeds

½ c raw sunflower seeds

½ c slivered almonds

1 (16 oz) package coleslaw mix

2 green onions, chopped

Dressing:

½ c olive oil

3 T white vinegar

1 T white sugar

½ t ground black pepper

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spread ramen noodles, sunflower seeds and almonds on baking sheet. Bake in the preheated oven until fragrant and toasted, 10 to 15 minutes. Cool to room temperature. Combine coleslaw mix and green onions in a large bowl. Pour cooled noodle mixture over the top. Whisk olive oil, reserved ramen seasoning packets, vinegar, sugar and pepper together in a bowl until dressing in smooth. Pour dressing over coleslaw and toss to coat. Chill and serve.

Birdie Ln Name Change?

During a recent property sale, the building committee became aware of a discrepancy in the Waller County records that listed Birdie Lane as Bogart. The committee contacted the county office, wrote a letter to request that the street remain as Birdie Ln and detailed the current residential history going back as far as 25 years. The request went before the Waller County Commissioners Court and was approved. The street sign was changed briefly to Bogart but now a new sign with Birdie Ln has been installed. The county has notified Centerpoint, the Appraisal District and the Postal Service of the official change. If you live on Birdie Ln, please confirm your address is consistent on all utility services.

Flooding Recovery Assistance

If you have suffered damage from the recent floods, you may qualify for assistance.

- FEMA is still taking applications in case someone had flood damage. Even if you had insurance, you may be eligible for some assistance through FEMA or the SBA low interest loans. You can visit the FEMA disaster area in Hempstead - located at Road and Bridge across from Dilorio's Produce. FEMA 1-800-621-FEMA, Disasterassistance.gov
- 2. Any donations moneywise can be sent to United Way Waller County in Brookshire. If it is marked for Waller County Flood Relief for April Floods, it will go only to that purpose. We have over 100 homes that were completely destroyed by the flood and almost 450 more that have filed claims. United Way phone number is 281-822-4200.
- 3. IMPORTANT Anyone who volunteered in any way fixing food for neighbors, helping to clean up for people in their neighborhoods, rebuilding or replacing carpet, etc. can fill out a form through United Way showing their volunteer hours. These hours are turned in to FEMA and there is a "monetary amount" assigned to it. When it is all calculated, then Waller County and their Disaster Relief Board which has been in effect since the fires in 2011 would get the money to continue to assist with disaster relief.
- 4. They stated they are in need of volunteers to assist people moral support, money, labor, etc. and that the actual time frame for having this disaster be completely cleaned up and resolved is about 2 years.
