This week you should have received information in the mail regarding one recent test that resulted in a higher lead content than the TCEQ standard. A letter from the water board and a brochure called "Lead in Drinking Water" were sent with your water bill. To keep you informed, this communication and any updates will be posted on the skylakes.com website under the Sky Lakes Water Supply Corporation section and also on the Facebook page. The water board is taking measures to investigate and ensure that the community water continues to be of high quality and safe. 5 Minute Fudge Wreath

Ingredients 1 bag semi sweet chocolate chips, 12 ounces 3/4 bag butterscotch chips, 9 ounces 1 can sweetened condensed milk 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1/2 cup currants 1 cup lightly toasted walnuts Butter Candied red and green cherries to garnish wreathes

Grease an 8-9 inch cake pan. Add all chips, milk, vanilla to large heavy pot over low heat, melt, add currants and walnuts. Wrap the empty condensed milk can with plastic and place center of pan, fill pan with fudge. Do not smooth the top - let the wreath be bumpy and irregular in surface. Decorate with cut red and areen cherries to look like holly bunches and chill. - 2. Check the weather and road conditions so you can limit obstacles and delays. Plan an alternate route through areas that commonly have road closures this time of year. Google Maps or Waze are navigation apps you can download and monitor traffic conditions on your phone.
- 3. If driving, have your car serviced and pack an emergency kit including blankets, water and snacks.
- 4. If flying, leave for the airport at least an hour earlier than normal to manage traffic, parking and security checkpoints.
- 5. Pack as light as possible.
- 6. Consider shipping gifts to your destination and wrap them once you arrive.
